A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SAMANTHA WATERMAN

At its core, ESD is about teaching individuals how to access and use the strength and power that resides within each of us. The benefits of ESD stem from a symbiotic relationship between physical strength on the one hand and emotional and psychological strength on the other. Having the physical strength and skill to defend ourselves from attack is only part of the equation, as evidenced by the martial artist who suffers in an abusive relationship, by the high school football player who succumbs to parental abuse, by the college gymnast who endures sexual assaults by her coach.

It is not just about physical strength and ability, or even martial arts training. The physical skills build a confidence that gives individuals the courage to learn and practice the emotional and psychological skills, and the emotional and psychological skills give individuals the confidence to use physical skills when they are needed.

We believe that this makes empowerment self-defense special—and different than the types of self-defense that came before. We believe, and research clearly shows, that ESD stops and prevents violence, including sexual assault and abuse, around the world. **It is the goal of the Association to make the public aware of ESD's effectiveness so that millions more can benefit from it.**

The Association's Advocacy Program, which is in its nascent stages, will make its first campaign a public awareness campaign, to educate the public about empowerment selfdefense. We will also join existing advocacy campaigns that raise awareness about sexual assault, violence against women, and much more. The Association will be doing this work year-round, from Sexual Assault Awareness Month in April through March when International Women's Day recognizes the struggles of women, from sexual abuse to harassment to unequal rights and opportunities.

I talked about the symbiotic relationship between physical training and emotional training. Like ESD itself, we believe that there is a symbiotic relationship between Association membership and successful violence-prevention. While we do our best to provide worthwhile and helpful benefits to our members and the ESD community, we think that by joining the Association, each member is also providing a benefit to the ESD community, and to the public at large, through their membership, helping to communicate to a wide audience the effectiveness of violence-prevention through ESD.

We hope that you will consider joining us.



Her second quarter of 2023 is focused on teaching ESD to professional women's groups, including the 'Women in Media' Abuja chapter, as well as Female Heads of Private Schools in Abuja.

MyPwr CSW Parallel Event International Launch of the MyPwr App!

On March 13th, Association Member and CEO of <u>MyPwr Ltd.</u>, Yudit Sidikman, presented the MyPwr App in a parallel event at the UN Commission on the Status of Women's Forum in New York City. The presentation also served as the international launch of the app (still in its Beta testing phase), the first product to teach the principles of ESD in a digital classroom. Yudit's presentation included live demonstrations of ESD skills, excerpts from the app and video footage from the instructor training in Rwanda. The 90-minute presentation was attended in person by CSW attendees, on Zoom and Facebook by friends and colleagues, and by 40 IMPACT instructor trainees who are in Israel for a training course.
