A NOTE FROM COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER TOBY ISRAEL

My father still loves to remind me of a debate we had once — something political — when I was a freshman in university. Frustrated that he didn't see the situation like I did, I sighed and said in conclusion, "Dad, if you knew as much about this as I do, you would agree with me!"

I had been studying, you see. Talking with friends deeply involved in this movement, reading op ed articles, and coming to my own conclusions—the right conclusions. Today, many years later, I still find myself tempted on quite a few occasions to revert back to that argument when faced with people who simply don't get it.

If they knew as much as I did, if they had studied gender-based violence and read the books on feminism (real feminism), if they had read all the dang blogs I wrote about empowerment self-defense... surely, they would agree with me. Right?

But, 18-year-old Toby's rhetorical default isn't helpful. It doesn't create understanding in place of prejudice, foster receptivity to new information, or forge connections in the face of starkly differing opinions. Rather, it reinforces silos and raises hackles. Tempting though it may be, I have other priorities now. I would rather be effective than right.

Do I still like to be right? Of course I do. We all do. But in my ongoing pursuit of personal growth, I have decided I don't need agreement; I need collaboration. And in my opinion (bet you saw this coming), so does the ESD movement.

So I wish to offer this reminder to you, my colleagues, as we consider where we are going—with our individual initiatives, with community or regional projects, and with the ESD movement writ large, which joins us all:



We can share deep knowledge about a subject, maybe even be in agreement on the essentials, and still see everything differently. Personality, culture, pedagogy, and a dozen other factors will see to that. However, agreement is not a necessary precursor to collaboration. Collaboration, on the other hand, is a requisite for success at scale.

As our movement grows, and as many of us come together this month in New York to discuss its future (and train, and attend VPEC), I hope we can celebrate our differences, listen with curiosity (and not for rebuttal), stay open to seeing something in a new light, and always, always consider that we don't always know what we don't know.

I look forward to continuing to collaborate with so many of you, as an ESD professional, as the consulting communications manager for the Association, and as friend, colleague, mentor, and student.

Credentialing in 2023


We think your incredible work in ESD deserves recognition and celebration, don't you?



Self-Defense is Collective!

Support the Crowdfunding Campaign for ESD in Mexico

Dayra Fyah, rapper and ESD instructor (ESDG graduate, Costa Rica, 2019), is seeking support for a new crowdfunding campaign for an instructor training in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico this month. Here are the cliff notes on the incredible work happening, and why it is of critical importance:

- 7 out of 10 women in Jalisco have suffered some type of GBV.
- In 2021, 71.9% of women aged 15 or over, declared having suffered at least one incident of violence.
- Since 2017, the Mexico Self-Defense Network, with active work in 8 states in Mexico, has provided tools to more than 10,000 women from different populations.
- They will carry out their next training to strengthen the skills of the ESD instructors in the country, and to bring verbal and physical strategies closer to the Jalisco community.

ESD LAC is proud to announce that as a result of a deep restructuring process, today it has a new identity: as RIA-LAC (or Network of ESD Instructors in Spanish. RIA-LAC is a feminist network with almost 50 registered members (and growing) committed to establishing and extending the reach of "Empowerment Self-defense" (ESD) as a critical strategy to address, prevent and mitigate violence in the region.

In recent months, in addition to restructuring, RIA-LAC finished their first Level A1 training in Guadalajara in June. The training was the first local event organized and hosted by participants trained in Puerto Escondido, MX, in 2021. It was a success, and 11 more community leaders are now part of the network of ESD instructors! This first training with (almost all) local instructors and participants is a big step toward building regional capacity!
