This month, as we honor the resilience and strength of indigenous communities, we also grapple with the stark and urgent realities of violence occurring in real time. The murdered and missing Indigenous women in Canada, the unreported and too-often ignored rapes perpetrated by non-indigenous and indigenous alike, and the discrimination. According to the U.N., indigenous women and girls are more exposed to sexual violence, trafficking, and domestic violence than non-indigenous. Just going to school can be dangerous for girls living in remote indigenous communities.

ESD professionals teach people how to find their power, how individual empowerment can prevent and stop violence. We do this both in the classroom and outside of it. One of the tools we teach is that of telling your story. We invite you (and ourselves) to make space for the TELL principle, to open our ears and our hearts to receive the stories of indigenous peoples around the world and, when appropriate, to share them. The Association invites you to share your stories with us so that we can share them with the ESD community. Perhaps telling these stories will do a little bit toward making a safer and more inclusive world for indigenous girls, women, and people of all genders..

Dear ESD Professionals,

November is a time to celebrate rich and diverse cultures, traditions, and histories and acknowledge Indigenous people's important contributions. Wherever you are in the world, I invite you to consider Indigenous Heritage Month as an opportunity to educate yourself and your community about the unique challenges Indigenous people have faced both historically and in the present day, as well as how they have worked to overcome these challenges.

We all have generational resiliency. Empowerment Self-Defense (ESD) teaches us the power of voices, choices, and standing up for what we believe in, and indigenous people have been fighting to have their voices heard for a long time.

Growing up as an indigenous youth in a predominantly white community, I had many customs that were perceived as foreign. I taught drum-making workshops with my family, did basket weaving, attended pow-wows, and went with my mother and grandmother when they did indigenous healing work. I often felt "other" and unaccepted in mainstream society. Learning ESD has brought me back to my roots, helping me embrace those parts of me that I had previously silenced in order to fit in. ESD has also enabled me to support other indigenous people from tribes and bands with whom I am affiliated and with indigenous groups where I live.

You have the power and knowledge to facilitate deep and lasting change in your communities, and you can do so through ESD and guided by your wisdom. I encourage you to take time to learn more about your local indigenous groups, meet with them, ask what they need, and see if you contribute or offer support in alignment with those needs.

We can all be the change we wish to see in the world if we truly believe in ourselves and see those who might otherwise become invisible.





September 16th, Northern California



ESD Professional Stephanie Cyr, ESDP was humbled and honored to be recognized as a modern warrior for using her martial arts training to broaden the reach of self-defense education, including the development of the first accredited ESD minor program slated to commence at San Francisco State University, Fall 2024 (stay tuned for more on that!).

"To be clear, when I teach empowerment self defense (ESD), I make a point of distinguishing it from martial arts and I always tell students you do not have to be a martial artist to become skilled in ESD. However I would not be an ESD trainer if I hadn't developed my autonomy and self efficacy through my martial arts training. So it was a special moment for me to be recognized not only for over 30 years of dedication to martial arts but my advancement of self defense education."
