A Note from our Executive Director

Celebrating HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

ESD has been growing fast in the Latin world and among Hispanics in the United States. We celebrate this work to empower and prevent violence! The Association's Finding ESD project is ongoing, but so far we know of ESD practices in Mexico, Belize, Costa Rica, Argentina, Chile, and Brazil. In addition, there has been at least one Spanish-langauge instructor training in the US. This will translate to ESD classes taught in Spanish throughout Southern California and across the country.

From Autodefensa Femininja to ESDG-LAC, Aliadas de la Vida to Mujeres Fuertes, Movimente Autodefesa to Atalanta Autodefensa, amazing instructors are helping people who face or risk facing abuse and violence. ESD professionals are working with their governments, the UN, and NGOs to bring ESD to locations throughout Latin America. For instance, Aliadas de la Vida, led by Dayra Fyah and her team of instructors, is filling a particularly keen need in Ecatapec, Mexico, one of the many places where levels of violence against women and femicide rates are extraordinarily high. According to the UN, especially since COVID, there has been an increase in violence against women in Latin America and the Caribbean. The need for empowerment self-defense has never been more apparent—empowering people through ESD instruction may be the most important step we can take to stop these attacks and change the culture of violence.

The voices of Latinas and people of all genders who have risked expressing their opposition to violence have never been louder and more powerful than they are now. This is the moment for the ESD community to expand and empower every person who has elevated their voice against violence, this is the moment to empower Latinx women and men from countries in the Americas and throughout the world with empowerment self-defense.

A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It's almost fall in the Northern Hemisphere, nearly spring south of the equator. I can't believe it, it feels like the beginning of July to me. But here above the equator, schools are starting up, kids are getting their books ready, and while the leaves may be dropping, to me it feels like a season of beginnings. Down south, it's nearly the season of birth and growth. For the Association, no matter the hemisphere, it feels like one long season of continuous growth.

We recently launched our inaugural Credentialing Program and have started taking applications for the 2022 exam periods. We are excited about the opportunities this will open up for ESD professionals around the world. Want to work with the UN? They may ask for a credential. Your local school district wants to see some paperwork before they invite you teach their students? A credential will do the trick. Want to take referrals from the courts (and in the US, have them covered by Medicare)? The Association will advocate for courts and other government agencies to accept ESD credentials instead of requiring you go back to school for social work degrees. Which leads me to the next new thing.

This September, we will begin creating our development plan for the Advocacy & Lobbying Program. We will research issues and legislation of interest to ESD professionals at conferences, online, and through surveys to you and other ESD professionals. I will be reaching out to ESD leaders to ask them about their priority issues and goals. We will be looking to ESD professionals like you to help us prioritize grassroots campaigns and lobbying efforts so that we develop a program that reflects the priorities of the greater ESD community. We will also be asking you to recommend ESD, violence–prevention, women's and equal rights organizations and campaigns with whom we can partner, because by joining together, we can amplify our voices and become even more impactful.

Finally, we are getting our membership portal polished up, which doesn't sound very exciting, but having that completed will make registration for membership and events much easier and communications among members more fun. And for our staff here at the Association, it will free up time for us to focus on community outreach, bringing members new programs and resources, working with advisory councils to build the continuing education and accreditation programs, designing our online magazine, and building the advocacy program.
